Friday, June 18 – Monday, June 28, 2010

Friday, June 18

We leave Brooklyn, New York & New Jersey and begin our drive west to Zanesville, Ohio where we have overnight accommodations and dinner.

Saturday, June 19

After breakfast this morning, we check out of our hotel and drive to Nashville, Tennessee. Accommodations are in Nashville for the next 2 nights. After refreshing ourselves, we enjoy a delicious dinner and then drive to The Grand Ole Opry for an enjoyable evening of entertainment.



Sunday, June 20

Breakfast begins our day. Then it's off on a full day tour of Nashville, Tennessee. We will see, among other things, the State Capitol, the Parthenon, Fort Nashborough and the home of the stars of country music. The local tour guide is well versed in the tradition and customs of the area and we will get a genuine glimpse into the life and times of Nashville. Dinner is on our own tonight.

Monday, June 21

After breakfast, we drive to Memphis where we have overnight accommodations and dinner. We'll visit Graceland – the home of the famous Elvis Presley. The self-guided tour includes admission to the Graceland Mansion and the plaza's attractions - Elvis's Custom Jets exhibit, Elvis Automobile Museum, Sincerely Elvis Museum and the Private Presley exhibit.

Tuesday, June 22

A hearty breakfast awaits us this morning. We then check out of our hotel and visit The National Civil Rights Museum. Housed in the Lorraine Motel where Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated, the museum presents a film that sets the stage for the dramatic exhibits. Next is a visit to the Sun Studio -- a small recording facility where such music legends as Johnny Cash, B.B.King, Jerry Lee Lewis, Roy Orbison and Elvis Presley began their recording careers. Our drive continues to Bowling Green, KY where we have dinner and overnight accommodations.

Wednesday, June 23

We check out of our hotel this morning after breakfast and visit the Mammoth Cave – said to be the longest cave system known. It contains remnants of 4,000 year-old stick cane torches, woven sandals and names written on the cave walls by guides during the 19th century using candle smoke. Next is a visit to the Abraham Lincoln Birthplace National Historic Site that depicts the one room log cabin where our 16th President was born. We'll see a diorama of the Thomas Lincoln farm, exhibits about the family and a movie "Lincoln-the Kentucky Years". Our drive continues to Louisville. We check into the Crown Plaza Hotel where we have accommodations for the next 4 evenings.

Thursday, June 24 – Saturday, June 26

Enjoy the Louisville Square Dance Convention.

Sunday, June 27

We'll check out of our hotel this morning and drive to Wheeling, West Virginia where we have dinner and overnight accommodations.

Monday, June 28

This final day of our tour begins with a hearty breakfast. We then check out of our hotel and begin our pleasant journey
